- 11:40 2025 Budget Review by Finance Committee Doug Burden, Martha Read
 - ♦ Lower number of pledging households this Fiscal Year; 218 vs. 234 prior year
 - ♦ Strong pledge growth per member
 - ♦ Strong rental income growth
 - ♦ Higher administrative costs (insurance)
 - \$4,000 of credit card fees to be managed by encouraging pledgers to include fees when making pledge payment

- Personnel increases driven by health insurance and \$12,000 for music assistant picked up by Music Committee prior year
- ♦ Goal to increase salaries to midpoint but no COLA this year
- ♦ Key item was staff transition to different model
- Henry Frost program increase from construction level rental rate to \$90,000 annual rent at operating level
- ♦ Hungarian School rent increasing from \$14,000 to 17,000
- ♦ Budgeting \$8,000 for incidental rentals
- ♦ Fundraiser budget will include children's musical
- ◊ Asst. Minister budget includes one-time moving expense & professional expenses
- ♦ Increased Building & Grounds budget
- ♦ Increase for Music but does not include request for instrument rebuilds/repairs needed
- This year's \$36,994 surplus to be applied to '25 deficit of \$37,277 to extend Adult Programs Director thru June '25
- Advanced Planning model in place to identify expense requests earlier in cycle.
- ♦ Stabilization Fund around \$81,000 at roughly 10% of annual costs
- Endowment increased from \$2,054,000 to \$2,343,000 with 3.5% paid to annual budget, \$55,000

 - ♦ Follow up on areas for improvement in following years
 - ♦ Showed strong evidence of an active & vibrant congregation
 - ◊ Written report provided in Annual Meeting packet
 - ♦ Staff changes were a tender subject this year
 - ♦ Also, fair compensation to all staff a key need
 - ♦ 171 respondents to survey, over twice last year's participation in Listening Circles
 - ♦ No respondents under 29 years old, key demographic
 - ◊ Lacked formal outreach to Youth Group, need for future focus
 - ♦ Comments received totaled 477

- Reasons for coming to FCB: First was belonging & community, second was spiritual & uplifting
- ◊ Needing improvement areas: pastoral care & support for lay leaders
- ◊ Key needs identified: Children's Religious Education and support for parents
